Internal Auditor Report - Year ended 31 March 2022

Dear Mrs Keppel-Spoor

Please find herewith your annual internal audit report for Kirk Langley Parish Council, carried out on 28th June 2022 at your office in Aston on Trent, Derbyshire.

I have audited the available information in accordance with the checklist provided by PKF Littlejohn LLP and Derbyshire Association of Local Councils. My findings are as follows:

- There is little evidence of appropriate accounting records to inspect/audit. A single
 spreadsheet was made available which detailed various payments on dates which
 corresponded to meeting dates, however you explained to me that you were very recently
 appointed as the Responsible Financial Officer to this post, and though you having been
 fulfilling a locum clerk role for some time, the previous clerk had deleted much of the required
 information to give a full picture of the accurate accounts.
- There is no evidence to suggest that financial regulations have been followed, not all
 payments are supported by invoices and not all expenditure is approved. There is no evidence
 available to support VAT recording has been completed accurately.
- 3. There is no evidence of risk management in place in relation to financial matters.
- 4. There is no evidence of any democratic budget setting to support the precept request. Indeed you have informed me that this this is reported to be something the previous clerk completed on her own and presented to the Council as a final document. There is no evidence of budgetary approval.
- The evidence presented concludes that all expected income was received and properly recorded.

6. Petty Cash is not held by the Parish Council and was therefore not covered by this audit.

7. Employee salaries is an anomaly. You have informed that the previous Clerk was self-employed and was responsible for

submitting her own PAYE and NI/Tax payments. According to the HMRC, Parish Council Clerks have not been allowed to be self-employed since 2011 and there is a legal topic note to support this. You have also supplied evidence to the contrary, supplied by HMRC themselves, however for the purpose of audit, I must highlight that employment arrangements and payment of salaries has not been adequately, or appropriately recorded. You inform me that this is now rectified, you are an employee of Kirk Langley Parish Council and your salary is paid in accordance with the correct PAYE procedures.

- Asset registers were unavailable to view at the time of audit, they cannot be assumed to be correct.
- 9. No bank reconciliation has been recorded throughout the whole financial year.
- 10. Accounting statements were unavailable to view, there was no cash book to show any record of transactions to support the bank statements. These accounts should be prepared on an income and expenditure basis and each transaction should be supported by a line in the cashbook which can be evidenced from a robust paper trail. There are no debtors to the Parish Council.
- 11. It is unclear from the available paperwork whether or not this authority was exempt in the previous financial year, however, based on the limited evidence available, it was suggested that the AGAR Form 3 is completed this year regardless of requirement to offer some financial transparency for this council.
- 12. Much of the required information remains missing from the website, which is largely due to the implementation of a new website at the end of 2021. You have informed me that this will be rectified and additional information is in the process of being added as it becomes available.
- 13. It is reported that correct period of exercise was adhered to in the previous financial year by way of a paper notice on the noticeboard placed in the parish.
- 14. The publication of the previous financial year statements were not added to the website, thus the publication requirements were incomplete.

I am happy to offer guidance and support where required to enable an easier audit process to be in place for the next financial year and as an additional offer, I am happy to return midterm and complete a full governance review knowing that this parish council are undergoing many changes following your appointment as Clerk & Responsible Financial Officer.
